

Degree Map 2025-26 LWPP Major

This degree map is designed to serve as a guideline to complete a Bachelor of Arts in 4 years. This degree map is not applicable for the iBA or any of the joint degree programs. It is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for the appropriate courses and have all required prerequisites. The <u>Calendar</u> is the authority on university regulations. This degree map is not a substitute for academic advice. All courses are <u>not</u> offered each semester or even each year. Spring semester course offerings are limited. The information below assumes courses will be offered in the semesters indicated. The HSS course offerings <u>web page</u> is an important tool for planning courses. Students are also advised to consult with an <u>Academic Advisor</u>. All course prerequisites, as identified in the Calendar, will apply.

A Bachelor of Arts degree requires the successful completion of a minimum of 120 credit hours of course work as outlined in the Calendar. This degree map has been prepared to guide you in your pursuit of a **36-credit hour major** and **24 credit hour minor**. If, the second program you choose requires more than 24 credit hours, you will use electives to make up the additional courses. Again, a BA requires the completion of at least 120 credit hours.
