A Bachelor of Arts degree requires the successful completion of a minimum of 120 credit hours of course work as outlined in the Calendar. This degree map has been prepared to guide you in your pursuit of a **36 credit hour major** and **24 credit hour minor**. If, the second program you choose requires more than 24 credit hours, you will use electives to make up the additional courses. Again, a BA requires the completion of at least 120 credit hours.
